# What has happened in your week?

In our busy lives we often 'live in the present' and spend time worrying about what is to come. I encourage you to move beyond these and benefit from the gift of reflection. Catholics can reflect on their week through various practices like prayer, reading scripture and examining their actions. These can be powerful healing, strengthening and guiding practices.

I try to use the 'Examen' at the end of each day, unless I nod off in my chair after a full day which is, unfortunately, a frequent happening. The Examen is a prayerful reflection practice developed by St. Ignatius Loyola, founder of the Jesuit order. It involves reviewing the day's events and seeking God's presence in those moments. The goal is to recognize God's guidance and love, as well as areas where one's actions or thoughts might have fallen short.

You might try the Examen as an easy and effective means of daily reflection. Just spend a little time reflecting, praying, on these five points:

- 1. Become aware of God's presence.
- 2. Review the day with gratitude.
- 3. Pay attention to your emotions.
- 4. Choose one feature of the day and pray from it.
- 5. Look toward tomorrow.

Using such spiritual reflection practices can reveal amazing things. Things that you sometimes don't realise are happening and moving in your life. They can help you to be better aware of the influence of the Holy Spirit in your life.

#### Novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

A Catholic novena is a devotional practice that consists of prayer repeated for nine consecutive days. The word *novena* comes from the Latin *novem*, meaning "nine." It's a form of petition or intercession and is often associated with specific intentions such as healing, guidance, or a special favour.

This Wednesday we begin our novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus which will reach its end on the Feast of the Sacred Heart on the 27<sup>th</sup> June. Will you come and be a part of this novena? It will take commitment and devotion, but the rewards are great! So, think about joining our novena this year. The Novena Prayer is given below so that if you are unable to get to every Novena Mass you can still join in with the novena prayer each day.

#### Novena Prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

O my Jesus, you have said: "Truly I say to you, ask and you will receive, seek and you will find, knock and it will be opened to you." Behold I knock, I seek and ask for your help in my need that you may hear my petition. Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in you. O my Jesus, you have said: "Truly I say to you, if you ask anything of the Father in my name he will give it to you." Behold, in your name, I ask the Father to hear my petition.

(In silence mention your personal petition)

Sacred Heart of Jesus - I place all my trust in you!

Immaculate Heart of Mary – Pray for me now and at the hour of my death.

#### **Be Vigilant and Pray for Tortured Souls**

Our Dean, Mgr. Dave Heywood shared that there was an incident at St Mary's Shrine in Warrington last week. Fr Miklos shares the following:

"A man, entered the church in the early afternoon yesterday, entered the sanctuary by simply stepping over the altar rails, heading straight to the high altar and to the tabernacle, fiddling around a bit as he was looking for something (a key maybe?), then going to the side chapel he turned the altar cross around, and then in the confessional he turned a crucifix upside-down and the card with the rite of confession also upside-down, then he went towards the exit, blew out the votive candles at Our Lady's statue, and then in the narthex he tore some devotional brochures and left. In the end, he did not accomplish much, and there is no significant material damage either, nevertheless his behaviour seemed quite nefarious. He may have stolen or desecrated the Blessed Sacrament if it had not been kept safe enough.

The incident has been reported to the Police, who have visited St Mary's, and to the Archdiocese. I share this with you in case the person decides to visit other churches in the area."

We pray for the community at St. Mary's and for all those who are tortured in mind or spirit.
