"Deep peace, God's peace"

One of my favourite places is Lindisfarne, otherwise known as Holy Island in Northumberland. I first went there in the first year of my training to become a priest and I immediately fell in love with the place! The island is steeped in the spirituality of the northern saints and the sense of peace that I find there is palpable. I have returned to Holy Island many times for a visit, on retreat and taking groups of young people to experience the wonder of the place. Taking a group of 25 teenagers on retreat was a real time of 'awe and wonder', Claire Lawson, the youth worker from my last parish and myself packed the youth into a couple of mini buses and off we went. The island is cut off from the mainland for the majority of the time, so once we were on there was nowhere for anyone to go, so we were all able to 'roam free'.

Leading a retreat can be a lot of work, but leading that group for those 4 days was a wonderfully easy experience as they simply experienced the peace, the deep peace of that special place; we walked, we talked, we prayed and we celebrated Mass inside and outside of the house we were staying. It was truly a time that was 'of God'.

This is so important for me to remember as I have a tendency to make things difficult for myself, by overcomplicating what could be a simple thing; especially in my prayer life!

I suggest that most of us can, at times, struggle with our prayer lives. For me, it is because I over complicate it, I make it difficult when it could be easy, prayer, for me, is simply being in the presence of God, taking the mind of God onto myself and being with Him. I don't have to 'do', I have to 'be'. In prayer we ask for what we need, and at this time, perhaps we all need the gift of peace, that deep peace that can come from God alone. When I need the gift of peace I often think of my times on Holy Island and remember the peace that I experienced there and ask God to give me a sense of that peace in my prayer.

So perhaps, in your prayer this week, go to your 'happy peaceful place' and ask for the gift that you need from Him and simply 'be' with Him.

Magnificat and St Paul's Missal




