Reflection

May is traditionally a month devoted to our Blessed Lady, and many of us will remember crowning statues of Our Lady during this month.

Behind all devotions to Mary is the doctrine that Mary, being the mother of Jesus is also then the mother of God. And because Jesus from the Cross gave her over to John to take her as his mother, gave her to all of us as well. As our Blessed Mother, she is always caring for her beloved children with not just a maternal love, but a maternal love that is heavenly, and as our earthly mother's care for us in ways big and small, so too does our Heavenly Mother.

As Catholics, devotion to Mary is part of our daily lives, through saying the rosary, through lighting candles at church or in our homes, and through the different types of novenas prayed to Our Lady. She is the one who intercedes for us throughout our lives. It is always interesting to see how every time there is a Marian apparition, it is always to those who are meek, humble, lowly and nobodies in society. Mary has never appeared to an investment banker, a captain of industry or prime minister of a country. She has never appeared before a celebrity or anyone remotely famous. Her choice has always been for children, many of whom were uneducated. In fact, her focus seems to be on the poor.

Let's not however reduce our devotion to sentimentality, as we run the risk of our devotion becoming superstition. Our devotion should lead us to her Son Jesus, through our willingness to say "yes" as she did to loving and following Him. It is to the Mary who was the Mother of Our Lord, who suffered, who cried, who surrendered herself for him to whom we pray.

It is this Mary that May's devotions honor, and it is this Mary who is crowned the Queen of Heaven. How blessed we are to be able to call her Mother. *Fr Carl*

My name is Fr Thomas Clarke and I have been a priest of the Archdiocese for just under two years. I was born and raised in South Liverpool and was an altar server at St Charles Borromeo Church from the age of seven right up until my departure for seminary aged eighteen.

My teenage years were filled with laughter, learning and friendship, thanks to the blessed time I spent at St Edward's College. This special time in my life nurtured my lifelong interests in music, history, politics, foreign languages and theology, and in many ways acted as a junior seminary experience whilst I quietly discerned a priestly vocation.

When all of my school friends departed for university, my life took a different direction as I embarked upon my first year of seminary training in Spain, followed by six challenging but very happy years at Oscott seminary in Birmingham.

The last two years have provided a wonderful variety of pastoral work including hospital chaplaincy, prison chaplaincy and high school chaplaincy, all alongside the weird and wonderful daily happenings of parish life and the challenges of the pandemic.

I feel privileged to be joining the wonderful team of clergy at St Wilfrid's parish. I look forward to getting to know you all well and to serve the parish community faithfully. We look forward to welcoming Fr Thomas in September.


'May is the month of Mary'.

Reception of Holy Communion


