### From Rag Rolling to Riches

If there's one thing I know for sure, it's this: things speak differently to folk. I love to watch home restoration videos on social media. Time and again, while scrolling through these videos, the same narrative, with different people, appears: young couple moves into house, young couple takes up hallway carpet, young couple discovers minton tile/parquet floor and says with horror, "*how on earth could anyone have covered this?*"

When I lived in Derby, I was horrified to learn that the City's only Georgian square had been demolished to make way for a concrete ring road in the 1960s. A hideous, bizarre concrete ring road to me, but a terrific, innovative ring road to many. On another level, do you remember 'rag-roll'? Once very popular, now not very popular at all. I'd encourage you to google 'Salford Cathedral Restoration 2026'. This Cathedral was re-ordered in the 1970s, with many of its intricate Gothic features painted over or simply smashed up. What was left was a radically pared-back interior, devoid of detail and colour. The current restoration amounts to a complete U-turn, with the detail and colour now restored, or reinstated, at great expense. Was it hoped that smashing up altars and statues in the 1970s would trigger a revival? Well, we all know for a fact that the revival did not come. If we are to take Salford Cathedral as a case in question, we would now be led to believe that detail and colour will trigger a revival. Will it come this time around? Back in the 1970s, the modern world was not listening. Is the post-post-modern world listening now in the 2020s? Behind all of this is a call to authenticity. Tastes change from person to person and from second to second. Indeed, social relevance will be ever outlying for the Church. So, let's be who we're called to be and stop trying to look more like everything the Church is not meant to be. May we hear Bishop Erik Varden, who gave the Papal Retreat in Lent and encourages us: "*to know the saving power of Christ, the same today, yesterday, and always, yet making all things new.*"

## SSPX and FSSP

You may have heard that a conservative Catholic group, the Society of Saint Pius X (SSPX), has been excommunicated from the Church. The group incurred excommunication because they ordained four bishops without the permission of the Pope. Bishops are appointed by the Pope. To do otherwise fragments the unity of the Church. Pope Leo pleaded with the SSPX not to go ahead with the ordinations but to continue dialogue with the Vatican. Unfortunately, the SSPX went ahead with the ordinations and so automatically incurred excommunication as outlined in Canon Law. Vatican authorities are urging faithful Catholics not to attend the SSPX's churches, chapels and Mass centers lest they too fall under the same penalty of excommunication.

The SSPX is known for its celebration of the Mass and the Sacraments using the liturgical books in force prior to the Second Vatican Council. Happily, for those who are attached to the traditional Latin rites, here in the Archdiocese of Liverpool we have the FSSP (the Priestly Fraternity of St Peter), based at St Mary's Shrine in Warrington, which was founded by Pope St John Paul II for this very purpose. The FSSP is in full communion with the Church, accepts the Second Vatican Council and, as we have seen at our most recent Deanery Mass, is very much part of the life of our local Deanery.

Many of you will remember the recent photograph of the priests in the newsletter who were here in Widnes on the eve of St Pope John Paul II's visit to this country in 1982. Parishioners enjoyed recognising familiar faces among the priests who had served this area so faithfully. Many found it hard to believe that, just over 40 years ago, there were so many priests living out their ministry in this town.
