Advent - are we tourists or are we pilgrims?

Without due attention, Advent can become a mixed bag of chocolate calendars, shopping, office parties, merriment and activity, activity!

The Church takes a leap beyond this and observes a penitential preparation for the coming of Christ in history, mystery and majesty. In this holy season, John the Baptist exhorts us to once again "repent!" The word "repent" in the original Greek means 'to turn around' or 'to have a change of mind'. Having a change of mind looks like: going to individual confession, participating in the Mass more fully, reading scripture (the first few chapters of Luke are a good idea), fasting and being more generous. To do Advent is to put God first.

But are we tourists or are we pilgrims? An Advent tourist passes through the season, admiring the pleasant sights, sampling the cuisine and buying souvenirs. Touring through Advent leaves little place for spiritual gain.

We ought to be Advent pilgrims. An Advent pilgrim engages by confessing their sins, praying, reflecting, fasting and performing good works. By doing this, we make room for Christ. Walking a pilgrimage through Advent leaves so much room for real gain. The grace of God gets to shine through and transform our lives.

Don't be a tourist...be a pilgrim!
