## How ordinary is Ordinary Time?

In the reflection last week, I mentioned that we are now in the time of year the Church names as 'Ordinary Time'. At first sight, use of the word 'ordinary' might suggest that there is nothing special about this time, that there are no distinctive features. It might even suggest that it is dull. Indeed, in our day-to-day understanding we use the word 'ordinary' to describe things that are nondescript or dull. Nothing could be further from the truth when it comes to understanding Ordinary Time.

The word 'ordinary' can also mean customary, regular and orderly. Ordinary Time may also be called Ordinal Time, which means numbered time. Ordinal comes from the Latin *ordinalis* which means showing order, suggesting an order of succession. Again, in our day- to- day use of the word, 'ordinary' can mean customary, regular and orderly. So, Ordinary Time when used in a Church context is the standard, orderly, counted time outside of the other liturgical seasons. Be assured that there is nothing dull about Ordinary Time!

The period of Ordinary Time that we are in at present lasts until the day before Ash Wednesday, which is Shrove Tuesday. It focuses on the childhood of Jesus and then on the public ministry of Christ. Jesus's childhood established His human growth in wisdom and favour with God, demonstrating obedience, humility, and the value of all people. His public ministry revealed His divine mission through teachings, miracles, and compassion, authenticating Him as the Son of God and calling humanity to childlike trust and service, showing how His quiet upbringing prepared Him for His transformative adult life.

Gosh! Isn't Ordinary Time rather exciting?
