Good News at Last: Phase II Work Approved

We are pleased to share some long-awaited good news about Phase II of the building work to repair and restore the interior of St Bede's church.

Approval to Move Forward

After many hours of meetings with architects and restoration specialists, we have now been given the green light for Phase II to move to the next stage. The Historic Churches Committee has granted approval for the submitted plans, and this approval sits alongside Halton Council's approval for the proposed side extension and the support of the Art and Architecture Group from the Archdiocese.

Next Steps and Timescale

The approval process has been lengthy and detailed, covering everything from bat surveys and hedgehog reports to liturgical and structural queries. We are now beginning the next stage of appointing a contractor.

- St Bede's church will remain open for Christmas celebrations.
- Once the work begins, the church will close until the repair, and restoration work is fully completed.
- Subject to contractor appointment, work is expected to begin in January.
- The project is expected to take around 12 months.

Keeping Everyone Informed

We will continue to share further information as the project progresses. Once the contractor has been appointed, plans for the work will be displayed at each of our churches.

Looking Ahead

It has been a long and demanding road, much of it because the church is Grade II listed. However, it will all be worthwhile when the work is complete and St Bede's church is reopened in all its splendor.

Annual Mass in Honour of Venerable Elizabeth Prout

On **Saturday, 12th September**, at midday, parishioners from across the diocese will gather at St. Anne and Blessed Dominic Church in Sutton, St. Helen's, for the Annual Mass in Honour of Venerable Elizabeth Prout (the foundress of the Sisters of the Cross and Passion). Ven. Elizabeth is buried in Sutton, alongside Blessed Dominic Barberi and Venerable Ignatius Spencer, in a church commonly called *the church of the three saints*. Bishop Tom Neylon was originally due to celebrate this mass; however, due to his recent ill health, St. Wilfrid's very own Father Peter Ross has been asked to preside and preach. Apostolic Nuncio to visit Widnes!

The upcoming visit of the Apostolic Nuncio to the Medaille Trust on **Friday 11th September**, represents a momentous milestone in our ongoing mission to combat modern slavery and human trafficking. Founded in 2006 by a coalition of Catholic religious congregations, the Medaille Trust has grown to become the UK's largest provider of supported safe house beds for survivors fleeing exploitation. They provide a vital lifeline of refuge, trauma-informed medical care, legal guidance, and long-term outreach to help men, women, and families rebuild their lives in safety and dignity. By offering structured safe houses across the country, we work tirelessly alongside law enforcement and community partners to shift individuals from a state of captivity into full independent living.

Receiving Archbishop Miguel Mary Maury Buendia, the Apostolic Nuncio, who serves as the Pope's official ambassador and diplomatic representative to the country, is an extraordinary honour for the entire network. This visit acts as a powerful affirmation of our foundational roots and our daily commitment to Catholic social teaching, which demands the absolute protection of human dignity. For our dedicated staff, volunteers, and trustees, hosting the Holy See's representative brings global recognition to the quiet, vital work taking place within our safe houses. Most importantly, it sends a profound message of hope and solidarity directly to the survivors we serve, showing them that their journeys toward healing are seen, valued, and supported by the highest levels of the global Church.
